

Rules Chairman Report 2004-2005 Summary

Items addressed this year:

- Sportsmanship report submitted to the executive board.
- Reviewed and compared rules and by-laws from prior years, and submitted recommendations to the board.
 - Partial result (these updates are in the rules found on the DODL website):
 - Article I, Section 1, paragraph F – 1st division triples cricket must be played in order for points to be awarded.
 - Article I, Section 4 - Games will be played in the order listed except in extenuating circumstances.
 - The minimum number of games shot by any one player will be four.
 - Warnings have been removed. What this means is...
 - The first violation of the min/max rule will result in two points being subtracted from the violating team. A second and subsequent violation of this rule will result in all match points won that night being subtracted from the violating team
 - The home team Captain must call the league voice-mail with match results by noon of the Saturday following the match. Failure to do so will result in a loss of one point for the home team.
 - The home team Captain is responsible for mailing the score sheet to the Statistician. The envelope must be postmarked by the Monday following the match. Failure to do so will result in a loss of two points for the home team.
 - These points will NOT be awarded to the opposing team.
 - Fielding a maximum of three people is no reason to reschedule, and failure to play as scheduled will be deemed a forfeit, with points being awarded accordingly.
 - As discussed on message board, players participating in a game (not “match”) may not practice on any other board.
 - From 2004 AGM, any player voluntarily (without just cause) or involuntarily leaving the league (disciplinary action) will be dropped from the league for the remainder of the season, and all of the following season.
